



WHO NEEDS TO COMPLY?

- Any organisation that does business within the European Union (EU)
- Any organisation outside the EU handling EU citizens' personal data



WHAT DOES IT DO?

- Increases protection for personal data
- Strengthens penalties for non-compliance
- Extends regulatory powers beyond EU borders

WHAT DOES IT MEAN FOR INDIVIDUALS?

- Must give consent for their personal data to be processed
- Have the right to be 'forgotten'
- Can request a copy of any data held about them

7 TIPS TO HELP YOU COMPLY



- 1 Ensure data protection safeguards are integral to your products and services
- 2 Carry out privacy risk impact assessments
- 3 Be able to demonstrate adequate measures to protect data, including employee training
- 4 Plan for a breach, including mandatory notification of authorities within 72 hours
- 5 Have a legal basis for holding and processing personal data
- 6 Destroy personal data, both paper and electronic, once past its legitimate retention period
- 7 Appoint a Data Protection Officer

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
