Unique Regulatory Challenges Facing Small Businesses

The shifting data security regulatory landscape can be seen as a complex, burdensome, and costly barrier to compliance for small businesses. In fact, according to the Shred-it[®] 2023 Data Protection Report (DPR), most small business leaders (SBLs) agree that it is much more difficult for a small business to navigate changing regulations than it is for a larger one, and these concerns appear to be growing.

The unique regulatory challenges found in the DPR for small businesses include:

84% SBLs

believe that larger businesses have an easier time complying because they have more resources 76% OF SBLs (vs. 75% in 2022)

worry regulations will become more complicated and burdensome for small businesses in the future

agree that data and information protection regulations are tailored to large business
